PASTOR'S PEN

Dear Friends,

The Christmas season seems to get more involved every year. Christmas is a one day celebration that has morphed into a two month extravaganza. It is only mid-November, two weeks before Thanksgiving, and my grocery trip this week was already accompanied by Christmas carols. As the Christmas season expands, so does the controversy surrounding Christmas. Every year we are treated to the debate of whether we can say "Merry Christmas" to one another or whether it is more politically correct in our pluralistic society to wish one another "Happy Holidays." This year to add fuel to the Christmas fire, the government has proposed a 15 cent tax on Christmas trees. The Christmas tree tax was intended to be paid by growers to provide them with funds to promote Christmas tree sales. However once the media got a hold of it, there was a flurry of chatter about how even Christmas is being taxed. All of this leaves us once again asking what is Christmas really all about?

As Christians we have a delicate balance to strike allowing ourselves to enjoy all the festivities while at the same time not losing sight of the reason we have Christmas in the first place. Here are a few suggestions for how we can keep Jesus as the center of Christmas.

3 Give a spiritual gift to Christ. We tend to focus on love, joy, and giving during the Christmas season, but so often we pack these things away with our Christmas ornaments. This year let us seek to find ways to keep the Christmas spirit of love, joy, and giving alive in our hearts the whole year through.

I hope these suggestions help. I would love to hear other ways that you use to keep Christ at the center of the Christmas season. I hope everyone has a wonderful and blessed Christmas this year.

Stated Session Meeting
October 20, 2011

The Stated Session meeting was held in the church Conference Room, beginning at 12:20 p.m. with a devotional by Elder Petty and an opening prayer by Rev. Santer. Those attending the meeting were the Moderator, Rev. Santer, and Elders Phyllis Harmony, Harold Hebermehl, Julia Kasch, Pat Petty, and Jerry Pool. Elder Hazel Howard was absent. The treasurer, Pam Nicholas was also not in attendance.

CLERK: The September minutes were presented and accepted as amended with a motion by Elder Petty and seconded by Elder Pool.

Notable correspondence was reviewed as were updates needed on church records.

TREASURER:

The September finance reports were accepted by a motion from Elder Pool, seconded by Elder Petty.

After a discussion regarding the formal funding of the new outdoor sign, the general agreement was to use general funds as needed in addition to Memorial Funds (Jim Farrell). That motion was made by Elder Pool and seconded by Elder Petty. Motion passed.

PASTOR REPORT:

1. Rev. Santer noted that during the month she presided Scott Glenn's funeral, and attended the Quarterly Presbytery meeting. The welcoming party was also held.
2. The Stated Supply contract as revised was accepted by the Session and forwarded to Presbytery/COM for formal approval. The contract will cover the year 2012 and differs from the current one by a small salary increase and an additional week of vacation.
3. The Session will allow Rev. Santer to combine 2011 and 2012 Continuing Education budgeted expense (\$1,500). This will be used for a mission trip to Romania.
4. Rev. Santer will write a letter covering proposed disposition of the Sharpe funds.

STEWARDSHIP: Pledge Sunday will be November 20.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:50 pm.

Borger, Texas Called Congregational Meeting November 6, 2011

The meeting was opened at 11:30 a.m. with a prayer by the Moderator, the Rev. Dr. Santer. Active members present exceeded the required 10% of membership. The objective of the meeting was to review actual expenditures and proposed disposition of the Sue Sharpe bequest funds. Rev. Santer reviewed the data as presented on a table she prepared. Members of the Session were to listen to congregation members regarding their position on the table handed out and possible ideas for disposition. (The table is attached for complete review.)

Slightly over \$72 thousand has been spent thus far. In summary, expenditures are \$12 thousand for Word at Work and related, \$5 thousand to Rev. King, and a bit over \$55 thousand for repairs and improvements to our buildings. We have also committed \$10 thousand for the chapel at the new hospital.

One element of the distribution would be investing \$100 thousand in the Amarillo Area Foundation. Documents outlining this organization were also handed out. The funds table covers a total disposition agenda.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:50 am with a prayer by Rev. Santer.

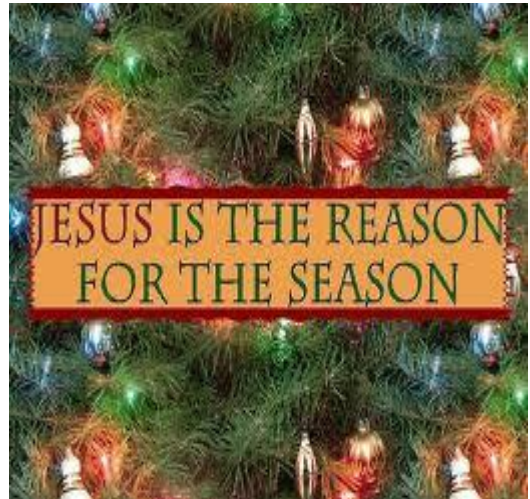

The Birth of Jesus

Matthew 1:18-25

This is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about: His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. Because Joseph her husband was a righteous man and did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly.

But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins."

All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: "The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel"—which means, "God with us."

When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took Mary home as his wife. But he had no union with her until she gave birth to a son. And he gave him the name Jesus.

Luke 2:1-14

In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) And everyone went to his own town to register.

So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.

And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord. This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger."

Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to men on whom his favor rests." ([KJV](#))
